The truly innovative Ambassadors program has introduced these students to the concept of ensemble playing as well as to the organizational side of performance.

DeGraff, a nationally-known concert violinist, teaches more than 30 young people and adults at his studio in Lewisburg. "This concert," he says, "is a tribute to the excellence and hard work of my most advanced students, and a 'thank you' to those who support us through the Monroe Arts Alliance and through appreciation of our performances."

## MEET HANNAH SOUKUP

"My brother Peter and I were about to start learning violin from a video course when Adam (DeGraff) intervened," Hannah says. "We had my great-grandfather's violin and wanted to begin lessons." DeGraff, a family friend and widely-known violinist, offered to teach Hannah and Peter "and he opened up the world of classical music to us."



"We've been studying with Adam for three years. I had never played an instrument, so I started late, but Peter was only 7," Hannah says. Now 17, she says being home-schooled makes it possible to devote early mornings and late afternoons to practice--about 4 hours a day after a regular school day and chores.

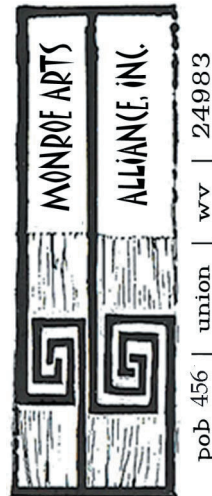
The Ambassadors of Chamber Music program brought Hannah together with two other advanced students and a cellist. "I play first and second violin and viola with the string quartet, which consists of two violins, a viola and a cello." The experience is intense, she says. "You need to know the other parts; you need to listen to each other and respect the music."

Hannah now teaches 8 students of her own as Adam's assistant. Violin is a passion, she says, but just one of many she hopes to pursue. "I love figure-skating, and I wish for an opportunity to follow that path."

## MONROE ARTS ALLIANCE ANNUAL REPORT 2007

The past year saw many innovations in Arts Alliance programming, including the Youth Art Show, the Member Reception and Concert in October, and the Monroe County Calendar project. Art workshops in oil and watercolor, and a new writing workshop were fully subscribed and thoroughly enjoyed. Our June Concert, with Kati Gleiser and Cherry Kim, was an especially exciting musical afternoon. These events take an enormous amount of time and effort to organize, and we thank all the members who participated in their success.

For 2008, the Board is preparing a survey to assess community needs and interests, in order to make our programming responsive to all.

### FROM THE TREASURER

Happy New Year to all. Here's a brief update on 2007 financial donations:

- \$8,100 Violin scholarships
- 5,590 Ambassadors of Chamber Music
- 1,275 Arts Alliance programs
- 125 Unrestricted

There were 80 paid memberships (new and renewal) in 2007, for a total of \$3,199.00.

Our big production: **The Monroe County Calendar!** Kudos to the MC Public Library Board, who sold advertising to cover the production costs. Receipts from calendar sales will be divided equally between the Library and the Alliance. As of Dec. 31st, 492 calendars had been sold: 176 at pre-production cost of \$8.00, and 316 at \$10.00. If you haven't bought your calendar yet, we still have some. It is more than just a calendar, it is a work of art--a real keeper.
